The importance of joy

The word joy is mentioned 218 times in the Bible, it is a major theme. God created us to take delight in us and we were created to delight in God. And just like we are commanded to love in the Bible we are also commanded to be joyful:

Philippians 4:4 Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice.

The fact that we are commanded to do this by our loving heavenly father means three things; it's a choice, it's essential and it's not impossible. No loving father would ever command his children to do something they have no control over or that he knows is impossible. God, like any human father, commands His children to do only what He knows is best for them, He then draws alongside them helping them every step of the way to fulfil this command.
