The Key to Peace

John 14:27 By Loyd Flaherty

I've heard prayers for world peace that sound so empty of power. It's difficult to believe that any peace will come from prayer — and yet, we are encouraged to pray for peace. We are also taught to be peacemakers.

1. Jesus gives us peace

John 14:27 "**Peace I leave with you;** my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and **do not be afraid**."

2. Fear never produces peace

When we begin to understand that God is with us, peace fills our hearts. We share the peace we have received because **love replaces fear**. Love changes peoples hearts.

3. The opposite of fear is love, and love brings peace.

John 20:19: "On the evening of that first day of the week, when the disciples were together, with <u>the doors locked for fear</u> of the Jewish leaders, Jesus came and stood among them and said, '**Peace be with you**!'"

Conclusion: Jesus said "I am sending you"

John 20:21: "Again Jesus said, '**Peace be with you!** As the Father has sent me, I am sending you.""
