2 Corinthians 1:20

1. Applying God's promises

2 Corinthians 1:20 *For all the promises of God in Him are Yes, and in Him Amen, to the glory of God through us.*

What this verse means is that for us, as believers in Jesus, we can claim every single promise of God in the Bible as our own.

Exodus 14:14 *The LORD will fight for you; you need only to be still.*

Deuteronomy 31:8 *The LORD himself goes before you and will be with you.*

There are thousands of these promises in the Bible. They become real to you when you apply them to your life.

2. Conditional Promises

There are some wonderful, unconditional promises in the Bible for anyone who accepts Jesus. But many of God's promises towards us Christians actually have conditions attached.

Ephesians 6:2-3 *"Honor your father and mother"—which is the first commandment with a promise— "so that it may go well with you and that you may enjoy long life on the earth."*

Proverbs 3:6 *In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths.*

Psalms 37:4 *Delight yourself in the Lord, and he will give you the desires of your heart.*

Isaiah 26:3 *You keep him in perfect peace whose mind is stayed on you, because he trusts in you.*

3. The greatest unconditional promise

Our motivation to pursue the fulfillment of all of God's promises towards us through obedience comes from the security of His unconditional promises towards us. The greatest of these is the promise of God's complete forgiveness for all our sins.

Psalms 103:12 *As far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed our transgressions from us.*

Jeremiah 31:34 *I will forgive their iniquity, and I will remember their sin no more.*
