"A Fully Committed Heart"

2 Chronicles 16:9a Loyd Flaherty

2 Chronicles 16:9a "For the eyes of the Lord range throughout the earth to strengthen those whose hearts are fully committed to him."

1. God is Actively Looking

• God is looking for someone to bless, strengthen, and use.

Example:

Just like a teacher looks for a student who's really listening — not the loudest, but the most focused — God looks for hearts ready to follow Him.

2. God Strengthens the Committed

- God's strength is not for the perfect, but for the committed.
- When we are all-in with God, He empowers us to do what we cannot do on our own.

Application: What's one area of your life where you feel weak or discouraged? Surrender it to God and ask for His strength this week.

3. God Can Use a "Yes" Heart

- Many people in bible were used by God not because they were qualified, but because they were available.
- A fully committed heart is a willing heart.

Application Challenge:

This week, try this simple prayer each morning: "God, today I want to say yes to You — in whatever you show me."

Conclusion:

God is not searching for perfect people — He is searching for hearts that are fully His. He promises to strengthen those who trust Him.

It's not physical war but spiritual warfare that applies to us today*: Will we trust in ourselves? Or will we trust fully in the One whose eyes are always watching — ready to strengthen us?

A committed heart is a strong heart — because it's held by the strength of God.

*Footnote: In the New Testament, we are not under the old covenant kingship or national military battles. But we are engaged in **spiritual warfare** (Ephesians 6:10–12).
