Redemption Through Repentance

Isaiah 43:1
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1. Redemption

Isaiah 43:1 But now, this is what the Lord says— he who created you, Jacob, he who formed you, Israel: “Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name; you are mine.”

All God’s promises in the Bible become personal to us through Jesus. God redeems us through Him.

Isaiah 53:5 But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on him, and by his wounds we are healed.

This is the price Jesus paid for our freedom. We can live lives free from the negative effects of sin and filled with His peace, hope and joy.

2. Repentance

Acts 3:19-20 Repent, then, and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out, that times of refreshing may come from the Lord, and that he may send the Messiah, who has been appointed for you—even Jesus.

Through turning to God we are transferred from darkness into His light. It’s the best thing we can do for ourselves and our families.

1 John 1:9 If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Saying to God, “I was wrong, you were right, I’m going to follow you.” This is how we receive the price Jesus paid on the cross for our freedom.
